Dr. Rado is an Associate Professor of Psychiatry and General Internal Medicine in the Departments of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences and Internal Medicine, Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine; received his medical degree from Michigan State University; and completed his residency in psychiatry and internal medicine at Rush University Medical Center. He directed a psychosis clinic for many years at Rush University Medical Center and has practiced primary care medicine for more than 10 years. He currently practices both psychiatry and internal medicine, and recently established a primary care integrated care practice program employing the collaborative care model.

His clinical interests are in severe mental illness, particularly schizophrenia and related medical issues. His research interests include prevention of the metabolic adverse effects of antipsychotic medications in patients with schizophrenia. He is the co-author, along with Dr. Janicak, of a newly published handbook for patients and families titled *Living with Schizophrenia: A Family Guide to Making a Difference*.

Dr. Rado recently co-authored an American Psychiatry Association position statement on the role of the psychiatrist in the physical health of their patients. He is currently President of the Association of Medicine and Psychiatry, a national organization focused on clinical practice and training at the interface of medicine and psychiatry.
