Dr. Angie Yu received her training at the Internal Medicine/Psychiatry combined residency program at the University of California, Davis Medical Center. While at UC Davis, she developed a strong interest in collaborative care models, integrating psychiatry into various medical care settings. Since her time of serving as the chief resident of the combined program, she has been a mentor to residents in medicine and psychiatry and an educator, serving as preceptor in the Doctoring Course at UC Davis Medical School. In collaboration with UC Davis faculty, she has worked on integrated medicine and psychiatry curriculum and also on the Preventive Medical Care in Psychiatry Practical Guide for clinicians.

Following residency, she has taken her combined training to Kaiser Permanente South Sacramento Medical Center to expand their integrated behavioral medicine specialty (BMS) care model to provide consultative to primary care physicians and to increase access to mental health care. Her role at Kaiser includes providing mental health education to primary care physicians, working across medical specialties and psychiatry to create innovative programs to serve the mental health needs of patients in the medical care home model, to supervise trainees from Drexel Medical School and UC Davis Medical School. She also has a special interest in working with geriatric populations, especially in the area of dementia care as well as complicated med-psych cases.
